#### Welcome to the 7th Cambridge Buskers & Street Performers Festival

Cambridge Buskers & Street Performers Festival is now in its 7th year (we took a year off in 2012 for the Olympics) and is the 2nd festival

that Cambuskers Community Group has organised.

The Festival's popularity has grown immensely and is a highlight of the Cambridge calendar. We have more applicants from overseas than ever before, who will perform alongside artists from the local area.

Cambuskers bring a diverse range of music, dance and street theatre to the streets of Cambridge. We also have music at d'Arry's in King Street, The Earl of Beaconsfield in Mill Road and The Six Bells in Covent Garden (off Mill Road). New for this year is a Cambridge Buskers marquee at Oakleigh Fairs Town & Country Show on Parkers Piece. You will find a map on the back cover with directions to these locations.

This free 3-day event starts between 10am-11am finishes between 4pm – 5pm, depending on the location and will be later in some venues, see pages 5-7.

The new Mayor opens the festival at 11am on Friday 12th June outside the front of the Guildhall. Cambuskers All Stars Skiffle Group is performing, as well as last year's winner Tom Korni, followed by a performance from Gyps'n'Progress, (acoustic swing gypsy trio) and D'Ukes, (a 6 piece ukulele band). Cambridge 105 are covering the opening ceremony and will be broadcasting live from the festival on Saturday 13th June from 2pm - 5pm.

This year we have more workshops than ever before at Millers Music in Sussex Street during the festival, for those wanting to learn the ukulele, harmonica or fiddle or want to improve on their playing, which you will find details of on page 14 & 15. New for this year we will have a banjo workshop and a mandolin workshop for guitarists who want to learn another instrument and/or improve on their musical skills.

We have a competition (for visitors to the festival) to vote for your favourite buskers. There is a tear off competition coupon on this page. There will also be a coupon in the Cambridge News during the festival. There will be fabulous prizes up for grabs for the winning acts! Drop boxes to post your coupons are at various locations, (details on the competition coupon). All completed coupons will go into a prize draw!

Apart from wanting to celebrate the variety of talent we have in Cambridge City Centre we also want to draw attention to the Street Performers Code of Practice (A Buskers Guide), so that we can increase awareness amongst performers of the need to adhere to this. It's also a guide for the public. This is available as a download from the City Council website.





# Cambridge Friends of the Earth



In 1974, the year that Cambridge Friends of the Earth was set up, an interest in recycling was the preserve of eccentrics, hippies and "The Good Life"

enthusiasts. Now Cambridge city residents are pleased to see recycling bins on our streets, expect that our council will supply us with bins to take away our plastic, paper and tins to the recycling depot and if this system breaks down demand an explanation immediately.

Lulu Agate, Group

Coordinator, finds this shift in public attitude.

Lulu Agate, Group Coordinator, finds this shift public attitudes and awareness extremely encouraging as one of the FoE of aroups nationwide is to help ordinary people to participate in the decisions about how their local environments are being managed and to feel that they have a right to do that.

"In the early days FoE groups usually felt that they were the voice of a minority whereas now we often find ourselves collaborating with other organisations towards shared goals. This is very positive as there are still lots of issues which urgently need to be tackled."

#### What are the current issues in Cambridge?

Climate Change remains the big issue on everyone's agenda with safer energy production topping the list of concerns arising out of those discussions. Although there are no plans for anyone to do any fracking locally this has of course been a hugely unpopular initiative by energy companies so we have been supporting campaigns in other parts of the country. Housing remains a high priority as national concerns about



the lack of affordable housing being built has given us opportunities to remind efficient people that insulation and heating systems reduce CO2. While saving money is such a hot topic helping householders consider how they can conserve and harness energy also keeps us

Harmonica Workshop with Steve Lockwood, 11am - 12noon (beginners & intermediate)

Steve's workshop is a rare opportunity for beginners, improvers and more competent players to gain instruction from a professional musician with 30 years of live performing forming the foundation of his teaching. Technical instruction is combined with hints and tips to make playing more musical and more fun.

# Banjo Workshop with Robin Gillan, 1pm – 2pm (for guitarists wanting to learn banjo)

Robin Gillan has been active on the folk scene for over two decades and is now beginning to gain wider recognition. His music reflects timeless old field recordings of the 1950's, 60's and 70's and early commercial country recordings from the 1920's. Described as a polymath musician, Robin delivers songs with power and sensitivity. Robin is adept at 5 string banjo, fiddle, harmonica, guitar and melodeon. Robin draws from the music of the British Isles and the USA. His playing has rawness, balanced by technical ability, producing an archaic

sound rarely achieved in the 21st century.

Robin has produced one solo album and recorded with numerous bands and artists, recently working with folk legend, Tom Paley. He has been booked at many festivals and folk clubs over the years, and recently performed at the



Cambridge Folk Festival. He also runs the Black Fen Folk Club in Cambridge. Robin has won several awards for his fiddle and banjo playing and has drawn the attention of such diverse musical figures as Reg Hall, Bruce Molsky, Yehudhi Menuhin and Noel Gallagher. www.robingillan.com

Matt plays fiddle, viola and mandolin. He is half of Kelly & Woolley, a cajun/folk duo, with guitarist, singer and songwriter Gary Woolley. Their first CD 'Papers in my Shoe' is due out in 2015. He is currently also playing in

'Thursday's Band', with Mark Gamon, Lucinda Fudge and Nick Blishen. Their 5 track EP 'Where the Breakers Roll' came out in April 2015.

Matt played in postpunk group 'Strumpet City' in Brighton in the mid-eighties, and with 'The Lizards', a cajun and blues band in South London in the late 80s. He played in 'Ti-fer Cajun Band' in the 1990s. He has recorded on various albums, including The Lizards Promised Land, Tony Hill Inexactness (heavy rock) and Mary Lou Lord Baby Blue (Americana). In his spare time, Matt plays classical music, teaches English and is a trade union and political activist.

"In the workshop, we will play tunes in a variety of folk styles, including Cajun, Appalachian and Old-Time, and look at improvising double stopping and accompaniments.
